

U.S. Humanitarian Response to Pakistan Floods

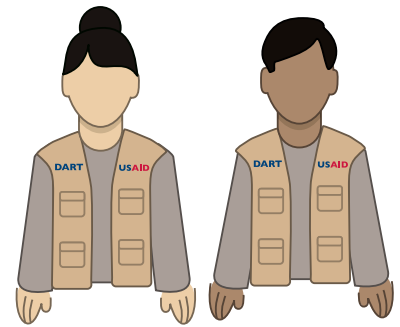
Since mid-June, severe flooding, as well as landslides and glacial lake outbursts, have affected **33 million people**, resulted in the deaths of nearly 1,400 people, damaged nearly two million homes and killed hundreds of thousands of livestock—a major source of livelihoods and food. At one point, approximately a third of the entire country was underwater. On September 2, USAID deployed a Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) to lead the U.S. government’s humanitarian response.

\$50.1 million in humanitarian assistance provided to support communities affected by severe flooding across Pakistan.

This elite team is working with humanitarian partners to assess damage, identify priority needs, and coordinate with humanitarian partners to provide vital assistance to the people of Pakistan.

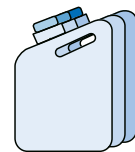

U.S. Military Support

To support USAID’s response, U.S. military cargo aircraft have begun **airlifting lifesaving critical relief supplies** from USAID’s Dubai warehouse to Pakistan. The U.S. military will be delivering up to 630 metric tons of USAID humanitarian commodities.
