## U.S. Humanitarian Response to Pakistan Floods

Since mid-June, severe flooding, as well as landslides and glacial lake outbursts, have affected **33 million people**, resulted in the deaths of nearly 1,400 people, damaged nearly two million homes and killed hundreds of thousands of livestock—a major source of livelihoods and food. At one point, approximately a third of the entire country was underwater. On September 2, USAID deployed a Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) to lead the U.S. government's humanitarian response.

**\$50.1 million** in humanitarian assistance provided to support communities affected by severe flooding across Pakistan.



## **U.S. Military Support**


To support USAID's response, U.S. military cargo aircraft have begun **airlifting lifesaving critical relief supplies** from USAID's Dubai warehouse to Pakistan. The U.S. military will be delivering up to 630 metric tons of USAID humanitarian commodities.


