

FEED THE FUTURE RWANDA KUNGAHARA WAGURA AMASOKO

Agriculture and food export has been identified as part of the transformation agenda in the Government of Rwanda (GOR)'s National Strategy for Transformation for higher value agricultural commodities and products' return, and particularly highlighted as one of the Six Reform/Transformation Areas in the Joint GOR-World Bank Future Drivers of Growth. While agriculture exports represent the 2nd highest portion of exports, growth in this sector is slow and underperforming, averaging only five percent annually. Inhibiting factors include limited evidence-based policy formulation, weak private sector advocacy and public private dialogue capacity, low capacity to attract investment, limited available financing and investment to create economies of scale. The Feed the Future Rwanda Kungahara Wagura Amasoko will contribute to the National Strategy for Transformation pillar of export diversification focused on accelerating economic growth in line with Vision 2050's aspirations for Rwanda to become a high-income and high-standard living country.

Activity Objectives

This activity will provide technical assistance for the following specific objectives in Rwanda:

- Facilitate inclusive and resilience-focused policy reforms using evidence-based analysis and strengthened advocacy capacity of the private sector organizations, and
- Support local actors to attract, mobilize, and direct public and private financing resources towards productive priority agriculture and food export projects supporting increased agriculture and food exports.

Expected Results

- 12 percent annual increase in targeted agricultural commodities exported at a national level,
- 50 – 75 percent income increase for at least 100,000 households,
- US \$300 million value of private investments mobilized by/through GOR agencies thanks to support from the United States,
- 25 new or adapted agricultural and nutritional-enabling environment policies analyzed, consulted on, drafted, or revised, approved, and implemented with assistance from the United States, and
- Five investment policies adopted because of research, policy papers, and advocacy efforts from the United States.
