OVERVIEW

The USAID Skills for Employment Project boosts the education, training, and employment opportunities for youth aged 15-29, including young women, persons with disabilities; LGBTQI individuals, as well as returned migrants aged 15-64.

PRIORITIES

With its activities led by local partner organizations, the Skills for Employment Project improves the long-term effectiveness of El Salvador's education and workforce development systems to increase private sector engagement and employment opportunities.

The project also improves the relevance and quality of education curricula so students complete high school and can have a pathway to a career and employment.
