OVERVIEW

The \$14 million Regional Alliance for Transparency and Anti-corruption will strengthen and expand the Center against Corruption and Impunity in Northern Central America (CCINOC), a network of a dozen organizations from El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras.

The project will support information exchange and best practices, joint investigation and documentation, and expand strategic partnerships and alliances to advance transparency and accountability in the region.

PRIORITIES

Through the project with implementing partner Cristosal, USAID will promote collaboration among reformers across Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador striving for more just and open societies.

The project will support CCINOC to share information to identify transnational corrupt practices and provide training to strengthen member organizations to detect and investigate corruption cases.

Civil society organizations (CSOs) concerned with corruption in El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras, can access technical resources and expertise from CCINOC.

Activities will include joint CSO investigations to expose corruption networks that operate across multiple countries and the establishment of a regional database that is searchable for publicly available information on corruption.

The project will also establish secure channels for reporting corruption and protecting whistleblowers from retaliation.

ANTICIPATED RESULTS

- CSOs increase public awareness about the harmful effects of corruption and impunity, and citizens demand accountability and support anti-corruption efforts.
- By establishing mechanisms for sharing information and best practices between countries, CSOs learn from each other's experiences and develop more effective strategies.
- By strengthening institutions, improving collaboration, and raising public awareness, CCINOC contributes to a significant reduction in corruption leading to a more just, prosperous, and secure future for the region.
